

The central Theme---Atonement thru the Blood

The central Feature---Its spiritual meaning

The central Word---"Holiness" occurring 168 times

- [13]. SPICES for Anointing, OIL Sweetness and preciousness of Christ (Ex 25:6).
- [14]. ONXY STONES Speaks of the Glory of Christ (Ex 25:7; John 17:5).
- [15]. BEATEN WORK This shows the labor, care, and skill which is required in ministry according to God. It is not simple gift, but gift stirred up, laboriously fulfilled, and strengthened by its exercise. (Ex 27: 20; 1 Tim 4: 13-16; and 2 Tim 1: 6).





Chapt 1-The Burnt Offering

- Christ's complete yieldedness
- Our Acceptance before God

Chapt 2-The Meal Offering

- Christ's complete consecration
- Our Heart's Desire for God

Chapt 3-The Peace Offering

- Christ's offering himself in complete love
- Our fellowship with God & each other

Non-Savor Offerings

Chapt 4-The Sin Offering

- Christ as the complete solution for sin
- Our sinful nature

Chapt 5-The Trespass Offering

- Christ's ability to pay the debt we can't
- Our Practice

Leviticus 1- the Burnt Offering

- The type- v. 3- male, without blemish, voluntary
- Key verse- v. 4 …"accepted for him"
- Types of Christ pictured in the type of animal:
 - Ox- the burdened one- Isa 53: 4; Matt 11: 28
 - Sheep- the silent one- Isa 53:7
 - I Pet 2: 22-25-no guile, non-accusatory
 - I Cor 6: 6-7
 - Rev 12: 10 (devil) –vs- John 5: 45 (Christ)
 - Goat- the sinless one- Isa 53: 8
 - Not wild or hunted, but domesticated. Goats don't slip.
 - Dove- the gentle one- lsa 3:9
 - Mary brought this because she was poor
 - We don't all comprehend alike; not to doubtful disputations Rom 14:1
 - Pigeon- the enduring one- Isa 53: 11

Leviticus 1- the Burnt Offering

The **Head-** He sought me

The **blood-** He bought me

The skin- He clothed me

The parts- Every part of His life was tried

The fat- The reserves/abundance He gave

The inwards- His heart was totally committed

The legs- He gave the strength of His life

Leviticus 2- the Meal Offering

- Ingredients:
 - -Fine flour (life's experiences)
 - -Olive oil (Holy Spirit)

- -Frankincense (joy)
- Salt (conviction)
- Ways to offer the ingredients, Nu 29 (no one suffers like me):
 - V. 2 In their natural state
 - God can use raw talent & energies
 - V. 4 Baked in an oven
 - Unseen hardship, trials & resistance make the ingredients of sacrifice more useable
 - Pictures the vengeance & wrath that sin arouses
 - V. 5 Baked in a pan (gridiron)
 - Fiery trials, Jesus was rarely without Satan's resistance
 - V. 7 Baked in a frying pan
 - Baked in the oil (trials intensified by the Holy Spirit) Isa 53: 3


Leviticus 5- the Trespass Offering Our Practice

Three rams for the Trespass Offering


- 1) For sins of ignorance (v. 15)






The Holy Place



The Alter of Incense




The Vail

God makes His way clear- OUR duty is to submit to it

Leviticus 10

- The three fires
 - The miraculous fire was a token of God's acceptance- ch 9: 24
 - The <u>strange fire</u> was an indication of complacency- ch 10: 1
 - The <u>devouring fire</u> was a response by God- ch 10: 2
 - They died because of their sin
 - Their coats & their position did not protect them
 - Presumption without fear- Heb 12: 28- 29
 - God often explains what He says, to show what He means- v. 3
 - God's work is serious business
 - Even though his own sons died, Aaron's function as the High Priest was more important & he could not become unclean by touching or burying his sons (what did Mrs. Aaron think??)
 - » He could not be unclean and function as an intercessor
 - » It was incumbent upon him to show the correct picture of Christ
 - » Could not rend his garments (the sins of others should not cause us to lose our integrity)- Ex 39:23→ Matt 26:65; John 19:24

Lev 11- 12: Laws of Holiness & Separation

Chapt 11- The divine guide-book for diet What we eat, we are

Land Animals v. 3-8

What to eat

Those that part the hoof (a separated walk)

and

Chew the cud (meditation)

What not to eat

Those that part the hoof, but do not chew the cud (Pharisees)

Those that chew the cud, but do not part the hoof (Hypocrites)

Water Animals v. 9- 12

What to eat

Those with fins and scales

Fins provide a determined course of travel

AND

Scales to separate the flesh from surroundings

What not to eat

Those that have no fins and scales

Fins, but no scales (self-willed)

Sharks/Rays- eat anything & everything Halibut/catfish- bottom feeders Blow fish, exotic fish- puffed up

No Fins (unable to determine their path)

Shell fish- remain almost stationary
Jelly fish- move where ever current goes
Crustaceans- garbage eaters

Flying Animals v. 13- 20

What to eat

Clean birds such as doves, pigeons, chicken, partridge, grouse, quail, pheasant

Our native air is close to the ground

What **not** to eat

High flying hunters- eagle, osprey, vulture, falcon

Birds of prey- owl, night hawk, all other hawks

Birds of pride- swan, peacock, pelican, stork, heron, jay, flamingo

Fowl that creep going upon all four legs- praying mantis, etc.

Creeping Animals v. 21-22

What to eat

Only "bugs" the can leap specifically the locust, grasshopper, beetle

The lame man of Acts 3: 8
walked & leaped & praised
God showing that redemption
frees a person from "clinging"
to the world

What **not** to eat

Everything else that creeps upon the earth including all other bugs, reptiles, lizards, salamanders, snails, worms...

...that cling to the earth (world)

This pattern of life is <u>not</u> the correct model for one who trusts God

The reason for these odd dietary rules??

Key verses are v. 44-47

- I am God
- You should honor me as God by separation/sanctification
- Holiness is separation in purity
- There is a difference, and you can make it

God confirms that the creatures we eat are an illustration of behaviors in:

*************Acts 10: 9- 17, 28, 34- 36 ***********

Leviticus 12-The Mother & Babe

Birth causes separation v. 1-2, 5

- Jer 1:5; Ps 119: 73; Luke 1: 41
- Birth makes the mother unclean
 - Causes social separation
 - Spiritual separation
 - Time of separation varies:
 - Man child- 40 days
 - Maid child- 30 days
 - Reason for separation
 - It pictures the consequence of the first birth (separation from God)
 - Allows time to create a bond between:
 - » mother & child
 - » child & mother
 - Protects both from visitors during time of immune weakness

Leviticus 13- Leprosy the type of SIN

Shows the close contact of priests with families which they served v. 1- 44

(representative of going to Jesus with every care & concern)

The priest was brought for every:

- -rising (pimple or boil) Pride, envy, lust
- -SCab calloused heart to hear God
- -burning bright spot or raw flesh anger
- -spreading baldness gossip
- -white flesh deadness or unbelief
- V. 12-13 all covered= confession (clean & given grace)









The process of a leper's cleansing v. 4-32

similar to restoration after Church discipline

Without the camp

2 birds (dove- gentle/ pigeon- enduring)
One dead- Christ's sacrificial death
One let go alive- Resurrection

Cedar wood- The cross

Scarlet- The blood of Christ

Hyssop- Humility

Water- The word of God

The process: one bird killed

blood 7 sprinkled times other bird dipped, set free wash clothes

again on 7th day shave hair

v. 8- come into camp, but remain isolated 7 days

Luke 5: 12; 17: 12; II Cor 5: 21

Sacrifices:

He lamb-trespass offering He lamb-trespass offering Ewe- burnt offering

Priest presents the leper

Trespass offering first v. 12

Burnt offering

Pronounce CLEAN!!!!!!!

General description of unclean issues:

- An issue of blood, mucous, pus v. 1-11
- The issue of seed (unclean until evening) v. 16-18
- A woman's issue of blood v. 19- 28

The cleansing:

- For the man v. 13- 15; for the woman v. 28- 30
- Healed of issue first (repentance)
- Perfectly clean- shut up 7 days
- Wash clothes (character)
- Bathe flesh in running water- Eph 5: 26
- Sacrifice/offering on the 8th day- New beginnings/ Christ is the healer
 & cleanser

- We excrete spiritual issues:
 - Mark 7: 21- 23

- Chap 16- The Day of Atonement- (the right way)
- Chap 17- Improper Sacrifices- (the wrong way)

Lev 16- The Day of Atonement

Procedures for the day

Offerings for the High Priest himself

- v. 4 wash his flesh & don holy garments
 - v. 17- accomplished alone Matt 26: 39 He prayed alone, died alone
- v. 3, 11 a bullock for a Sin Offering v. 11 (access)
- v. 12-13 offer incense within the vail & cover the Mercy Seat with a cloud
- v. 14 sprinkle the blood of his Sin Offering

upon the Mercy Seat eastward Ps 103: 12

before the Mercy Seat 7 times

Offerings for the congregation

- v. 5 selected
- v. 7-10 presented & lots cast
- v. 15 kill the Sin Offering & sprinkle the blood for atonement for:
- v. 16 atonement for the Holy Place & the transgressions of the people
- v. 18 blood of both Sin Offerings placed on the horns of the altar
- v. 20-22 sins confessed & the scapegoat let go (lead by the fit man)

Lev 16- The Day of Atonement

The High Priest finishes his course

- v. 23 takes off the linen clothes
- v. 24 washes, and dons new clothes II Cor 5: 17-21
- v. 24 offers both of the Burnt Offerings (worship & praise) & burns the fat from the Sin Offerings

The process completed

- v. 26 the "fit man" cleansed and brought back into the camp
- v. 27 the "available man" carries the skin, flesh & dung from the Sin Offering and burns them outside the camp
- v. 28 the "available man" cleansed and brought back into the camp

The picture completed

Heb 9: 6-15, 22-28; 10:10-24

Lev 17- Improper Sacrifices

The Importance of the Blood v. 10-16

- It all points to how precious is the blood of Christ
- Consequences had to be dire to emphasize the importance
 - v. 10- God sets his face against you
 - v. 10, 14- cut off from his people
 - v. 16- bear his iniquity
- Explanation of importance
 - v. 11, 14- since life of all flesh is in the blood,
 - v. 11- there is only one thing capable for use in atonement
- Specific instructions for dealing with life & blood
 - v. 12- do not eat blood
 - v. 13- pour out the blood
 - v. 15- do not touch dead animals not properly slaughtered

General Rules:

v. 6- don't approach next of kin (specifics v. 7- 18)

defn for nakedness- Ex 28: 42

- v. 19- don't approach a menstruating woman
- v. 20- don't approach another's wife
- v. 21- don't sacrifice children to idols
- v. 22- don't approach man like approaching a woman
- v. 23- don't approach animals

Reasons:

To prevent the proliferation of sin & depravity v. 25-30

To protect the purity of the Son of God Gen 22: 17- 18

Lev 19- Practicing Holiness


Understand that the **purpose of the Law** is **NOT** to improve your standing before God

- Accomplished by the blood of Jesus
 - Rom 3: 24- 25, <u>28</u>
 - Rom 5: 9-11

We obey Him because we love Him, and our obedience:

- Causes Him to be pleased
- "I am the LORD" used 14 times (2 fellowship x 7 perfection)
- Causes us to be joyful, due to freedom from sin
- I John 4: 19

Lev 20- Enforcing Holiness

- v. 10-21 Various sexual sins
 - v. 10 Committing adultery with another man's wife
 - Both put to death
 - v. 11 Committing adultery with Father's wife
 - Both put to death
 - v. 12 Committing adultery with daughter-in-law
 - Both put to death
 - v. 13 Committing adultery with a man (man with man)
 - Both put to death
 - v. 14 Committing adultery with wife and her mother
 - Both put to death (burnt with fire)
 - v. 15, 16 Committing adultery with a beast
 - Both put to death

Lev 20- Enforcing Holiness

- v. 10-21 Various sexual sins
 - v. 17 Uncovering the nakedness of one's sister
 - Cut off from the congregation of Israel
 - v. 18 Having sexual relations during monthly cycle
 - Cut off from the congregation of Israel
 - v. 19 Uncovering the nakedness of one's aunt
 - Bear their iniquity
 - v. 20 Marrying uncle's wife
 - Die childless
 - v. 21 Marrying brother's wife
 - Die childless
- v. 22-26 Summary exhortation- N.T. version is Gal 5: 16
 - Obedience = holiness & results in God's blessings

Principle of the Offering v. 17-30 v. 24*

- v. 24- Key is v. 7- "...it is his food"
 - It was the single source of food for the priests. The same principle applies when we make our offerings of time, talents & treasures as Christians. If we offer junk & leftovers, those on the receiving end are affected by it. Poor Christianity, slothfulness & lack of excellence are perpetuated. God gave His best, why shouldn't we???



The Light

- v. 2- Olive oil- pure - undefiled-nothing allowed to obscure the light

-Beaten- intense, stirred, enthusiastic. This shows the labor, care, and skill which is required in ministry according to God. It is not a simple gift, but gift stirred up, laboriously fulfilled, and strengthened by its exercise. Ex 27: 20; 1 Tim 4: 13-16; and 2 Tim 1: 6

The Bread

- Literally the "Bread of the face"
- Consider these verses:

John 6: 31- 35- "For the Bread of God is He which cometh down..."

:41- "I am <u>the</u> Bread"

:48- "I am the Bread"

:51- "I am the Living Bread"

:58- "This is that Bread"

I Cor 10: 16-17- "...The bread which we break, is it not the communion of the body of Christ? For we being many are one bread, and one body: for we are all partakers of that one bread."

It follows, then, that we should not think of this bread merely as that which maintains and nourishes bodily life, but symbolic of that life which consists of seeing the "face of God"

John 14: 9- "...he that hath seen me hath seen the Father."

Lev 24- The Light & The Darkness

The Darkness

- The product of an unequal yoke
- Rebellion is the child of a life married to the world
- Strife with the children of God is the outcome
- Satan's plan is to weaken & thwart God's plan
- Satan's realm:
 - Isa 14:12- "...O Lucifer,...which didst weaken the nations."
 - II Cor 4: 3- "...the god of this world hath blinded the minds..."
 - Matt 4: 8- 9- "...all these things will I give thee..."

The only one who could buy back all the kingdoms, did so!!!!!

Victory in Jesus

Lev 25- Rest, Jubilee, Redemption

The foundation is atonement v. 3

The triumph is liberty v. 10

The grace is forgiveness v. 35-38

The purpose is rest v. 5

The fullness is plenty v. 19

The result is restoration v. 13

The fruit is brotherly love v. 17

The certainty is found in confidence v. 20-22

The ultimate is dwelling in the land v. 23

Lev 26- Blessings & Cursings

- **IF:** -honor me as God
 - -keep my Sabbaths
 - -reverence my sanctuary
 - -walk in my statutes
 - -keep my commandments
- THEN: -fruitful land v. 4-5
 - -safety in the land v. 5
 - -peace in the land v. 6
 - -defeat of enemies v. 7-8
 - -respect from God v. 9
 - -fellowship with God v.11
 - -God's guidance & direction v. 12

- IF: -not hearken to God
 - -not do His commandments
 - -despise His statutes
 - -break my covenant
- THEN: -I will appoint terror,
 - consumption, burning ague (inflammation), blindness, sorrow of heart v. 10
 - -you will sow, your enemies will reap
 - -my face will be against you v. 17
 - -conquered by your enemies v. 17
 - -punishment 7x your sins v. 18
 - -break your pride & power v. 19
 - -make your heaven as iron & your earth as brass v. 19
 - -your strength will be vain v. 20
